Durham Celebrates Drinking Water Week

Local Student-Artists Honored for Water Conservation Posters

DURHAM, N.C. – Durham is asking residents to take a moment this week to recognize the City employees who work each and every day to provide clean, safe, and an adequate supply of drinking water to all who call Durham home.

In honor of 2016 National Drinking Water Week, Mayor William V. “Bill” Bell issued a proclamation at last night’s City Council meeting, declaring May 1-7 as Drinking Water Week in the City of Durham. The proclamation acknowledges the contributions of water plant operators, lab technicians, and other water industry professionals for their roles in providing drinking water to residents.
