i. In lieu of required street trees, Emerson Land Planning pllc are proposing a large octopus mural on the NE corner of the building. Emerson Land Planning are working with Darius Quarles to develop the mural.

ii. (UDO Sec. 16.4.2E.3.b.(3)) **b. Alternatives**

1. Street tree alternatives specified below shall be used, individually or in combination, and shall comply with the associated standards.

a. (1) Spacing and location requirements shall be consistent with those required for street trees.



- b.* (2) Maintenance of alternatives shall be the responsibility of the property owner(s) of the development site.
- c.* (3) Table of Alternatives
 - i.* Shall provide a minimum of 100 square feet of public art along the street frontage for each required street tree. Additionally:
 - 1.** 1. Public art shall be permanent and include a maintenance agreement.
 - 2.** 2. All-weather materials shall be used.
 - 3.** 3. Public art shall not include advertisements, but can include a placard indicating the name of the artwork, the name of the artist, and information about the artwork.
 - 4.** 4. Public artwork shall require a recommendation of approval from the Public Art Committee of the Cultural Advisory Board.
