The Durham City Council met in a regular session on the above date and time virtually via Zoom with the following members present: Mayor Steve Schewel, Mayor Pro Tempore Jillian Johnson and Council Members Javiera Caballero, Pierce Freelon, DeDreana Freeman, Mark-Anthony Middleton and Council Member Charlie Reece. Absent: None.

Jaqueline Wagstaff, a resident of Durham, spoke in opposition of the item; stated that it was an insensitive action; and that she disagreed with the logic that people in more marginalized communities would be able to run for office with the increased salary being proposed.

Donald Hughes, a resident of Durham, spoke in opposition of the item. He cited the increased taxes to residents as the basis for his position.

Seeing no additional comments, Mayor Schewel declared the public hearing closed.

Council Member Freelon thanked the speakers for their comments, however continued to express support for the item and stated that it would be a tool to address equity issues.

Mayor Schewel also expressed his support for the item and for Council Member Freelon for bringing the item forward.

Mayor Pro Tempore Johnson appreciated Council Member Freelon for his advocacy on the item; expressed support for the salary increase which would allow more access to public offices and would keep in line with providing everyone with a living wage.

Council Member Middleton stated that he had received feedback from residents that stated that they would have wanted to run for office, but would not have been able to support themselves on the current salary. He stated that his goal was to ensure that future members of the City Council would have a more livable wage.

Mayor Schewel asked City Attorney Rehberg to refresh the Council on their inability to obligate a future council to increase the salary.

City Attorney Rehberg advised that the City Council could only budget funds for the year that they were in.

Council Member Freeman asked if the council could ask the public to vote on the issue by way of a referendum in the same way they do for certain bonds.

City Attorney Rehberg stated that the topic being discussed was not one that was required to be put before the voters.

Mayor Schewel asked if there needed to be an effective date in the motion.

Mr. Allore stated that the full \$79,000 had been set aside so that it could have gone into effect at any time at the will of council's discretion.

Mayor Schewel suggested adding a date certain of January 1, 2022 as to when the new salary would be implemented.

The majority of Council agreed.

Council Member Reece asked if the Ordinance had been changed.

Bo Debrenski stated that section C2 had been updated with language discussed at the previous work session regarding 25% seating increasing to 50%.

Council Member Freeman appreciated the work of the item and asked if tracking could be implemented to note any impacts that were affecting businesses. She also asked for a future presentation with the Mayor’s Council for Persons with Disabilities regarding some of the language.

Director of Planning Sarah Young asked for clarification as to what tracking information was being requested.

Council Member Freeman clarified that she was requesting tracking on who was applying.

**ORDINANCE #15882**

**SUBJECT: EXPANSION OF THE LONGTIME HOMEOWNER GRANT PROGRAM TO INCLUDE THE WALLTOWN NEIGHBORHOOD (ITEM 26/ PR #14996)**

Bonita Green, a resident of Durham expressed her support for the item and also requested that the Braggtown and Merrick Moore communities be included as well.

Constance Wright, a resident of Durham echoed the comments made by the previous speaker and stated that there needed to be a city wide program for all low income homeowners.

Mayor Schewel asked what made a neighborhood eligible for the program.

Reginald Johnson, Director of the Community Development Department stated that the neighborhood had to have affordable housing investments during a particular time period.

Mayor Schewel stated that the city had asked the County to increase the AMI from 30% to

60% for the County wide longtime homeowner grant program, which would have made a lot more homeowners eligible as Durham residents.

Council Member Freeman advocated for including Braggtown and Merrick Moore to the city longtime homeowner grant program.

Council Member Freelon expressed concerns for adding neighborhoods by request.

Mayor Schewel asked City Attorney Rehberg what the concerns were if the city was to add neighborhoods with different criteria.

City Attorney Rehberg stated that the concern was appearing arbitrary and not having a clear process.

Council Member Reece stated that he had argued on several occasions to include Braggtown and Merrick Moore into the program; however, they did not meet the current requirements as far as having the city investment ties to affordable housing.

Council Member Caballero asked the speakers if they had reached out to the county about their concerns for their neighborhoods not been included in the county wide program.

Ms. Green stated that she had reached out the county and Ms. Wright stated that she had not.

Council Member Freeman asked if the county program included 2019 or 2020.

Mr. Johnson, stated that it included 2021.

Council Member Middleton asked if the Council could pass the motion Council Member Freeman suggested in light of the parameters laid out by staff.

Mayor Schewel stated that the Council was able to pass any motion that they wanted; however, the City Attorney cautioned against it.

Council Member Freeman clarified that she was suggesting revising the criteria.

Mayor Pro Tempore Johnson, reiterated the position by the City staff and advocated for the expansion of the County wide program.

**MOTION** by Council Member Freeman, seconded by Council Member Freelon, to adopt the revised Longtime Homeowner Grant Program criteria to include the Walltown, Braggtown, and Merrick Moore neighborhoods, **FAILED** at 8:54 p.m. by the following vote: Ayes: Council Members Freelon and Freeman.
