Durham City Councilmember DeDreana Freeman Appointed to Serve on National League of Cities' Transportation & Infrastructure Services Committee

DURHAM, N.C. – Durham City Councilmember DeDreana Freeman has been appointed to the [National League of Cities](#) (NLC) 2019 [Transportation and Infrastructure Services](#) (TIS) federal advocacy committee.

This committee has the lead responsibility for developing NLC's federal policy positions on issues involving transportation, including planning, funding, safety and security of public transit, streets and highways, aviation, railroads and ports. The appointment was announced by NLC President Karen Freeman-Wilson, mayor of Gary, Indiana.
