## **Durham Begins Construction to Replace Compromised Stormwater System on Faucette Avenue**

*Intersection with Amberley Drive Will Be Closed to Through Traffic Until Project Completed*

DURHAM, N.C. – If you live or travel along Faucette Avenue in Durham, you'll want to take note of an [upcoming construction project](#).

The City of Durham Public Works Department will soon begin construction to replace the compromised stormwater system at Faucette Avenue and Amberley Drive. Beginning on Monday, November 18, the intersection at Faucette Avenue and Amberley Drive will be closed to through traffic, and will remain closed until the repair work is complete. This area will be open to local traffic only and on-street parking will not be available during the project timeframe. Construction is expected to take two-to-three weeks depending on weather conditions. Signed detour routes for motorists will be in place throughout the duration of the project.

The project cost is estimated at \$287,361 and will be paid for through the Stormwater Capital Improvement Program (CIP) funds.
