The City of Durham is seeking interested citizens to serve on the following Board:

- **Citizens Advisory Committee – (Application Deadline – January 4, 2019)**
- **Durham Historic Preservation Advisory Commission – (Application Deadline–December 14, 2018)**
- **Passenger Vehicle For Hire Commission – (Application Deadline – December 14, 2018)**
- **Raleigh-Durham Airport Authority – (Application Deadline – December 20, 2018)**
- **Recreation Advisory Commission – (Application Deadline – January 4, 2019)**

Applications can be mailed, faxed and delivered to the City Clerk’s Office and must be received in the City Clerk’s Office by 5:00 p.m. on the above date. If applying online, the deadline is extended to midnight on the above date.

Due to resignations, there are currently two (2) vacancies on the **Citizens Advisory Committee** with the terms to expire on June 30, 2021.

This committee works to facilitate citizen participation in the planning and implementation of the Durham Community Development Block Grant Program. Residents living anywhere in the Durham city limits are welcomed and encouraged to apply. Applicants residing in predominantly low-to-moderate income neighborhoods or historically targeted areas such as Lyon Park, West End, Walltown, Gattis Street, Morehead Hill, Lakewood, Junction Road, and North East Central Durham are particularly encouraged to apply. We also welcome applications from handicapped persons as well as representatives of the business community, housing community, citizens representing PACs 1 through 5 and other interested civic groups.

The committee meets on the 4th Monday of each month at 6:00 p.m. in the Department of Community Development located at 807 E. Main Street.

Members serve without compensation and must reside within the corporate City limits.

Due to an expired term there is currently one (1) vacancy on the **Durham Historic Preservation Commission** for a **Regular Member** representing **Architect** with the term to expire on September 1, 2021.

The Commission provides a mechanism for coordinated and consistent planning for the protection of valuable historic resources. The Commission also addresses problems and coordinates limited resources which

promotes, enhances and preserves the character and heritage of the Durham Community.

The Commission meets on the 1st Tuesday of each month in the Committee Room located on the 2nd Floor of City Hall at 8:30 a.m.

Members serve without compensation and must reside within the corporate City limits.

There are currently (5) vacancies on the **Passenger Vehicle For Hire Commission** representing **Passenger Vehicle For Hire Operator (2), Elderly (1), Passenger (1)** and **Substance Abuse Prevention Sector (1)** with the terms to expire on January 1, 2020 and January 1, 2021.

The Commission shall hear appeals from decisions of the Taxicab Inspector and will also hear citizen complaints and recommendations concerning taxicab services.

The Commission meets as needed in the GoDurham Transit Administration Board Room which is located at 1907 Fay Street.

Due to a term expiring, there will be one (1) vacancy on the **Raleigh-Durham Airport Authority** with the term to expire on January 1, 2021.

The Authority governs the Raleigh-Durham International Airport. The Authority was created by the N.C. General Assembly to develop, operate and maintain the Raleigh-Durham Airport.

The Authority is comprised of eight representatives, two of each from the City of Durham, Durham County, the City of Raleigh and Wake County. Representatives appointed by the City Council must live within the corporate City limits of Durham.

The Authority meets monthly on the 3rd Thursday at 1:00 p.m. at the RDU Administrative Offices located at 1000 Trade Drive/RDU Airport.

There are currently two (2) vacancies on the **Recreation Advisory Commission** with one (1) term to expire on August 8, 2021 and one (1) term to expire on August 8, 2020.

This Commission works with the Director of Recreation and makes recommendations regarding recreation programs, facilities, resources and needs of the City.

The Committee meets on the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 7:30 a.m. at the Parks & Recreation Department located at 400 Cleveland Street.

Members serve without compensation and must reside within the Corporate City limits.

Members of a board, committee or commission shall attend at least fifty percent (50%) of the meetings in a given 12-month period. It shall be the policy of the City Council to remove that appointee in the absence of his/her showing good cause and to make another appointment. This paragraph shall not apply to members of the Human Relations Commission, who are subject to the attendance requirements of Section 34-108(e) of the City Code or boards, committees and commissions that have their attendance requirements addressed through by-laws or an interlocal agreement.
