City of Durham Contains Sewer Spill at 1405 N. Miami Boulevard

DURHAM, N.C. – The City of Durham Department of Water Management reports that on May 15, 2018 approximately 280 gallons of untreated wastewater were discharged into Goose Creek Tributary A from a sewer cleanout at 1405 N. Miami Boulevard.

The cleanout was found overflowing at approximately 9:15 a.m. The overflow was caused by a grease blockage in the sewer lateral, which was cleared at approximately 10:15 a.m. The surrounding area has been remediated and there are no immediately visible adverse environmental impacts or hazards to persons or property.

The City of Durham’s Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) outreach program provides education on the proper disposal of grease and other materials. Only water, human waste, and toilet paper are permitted to be discharged into the sewer system. FOG program staff will take appropriate enforcement action when necessary. Additionally, Water & Sewer Maintenance crews proactively inspect and clean sewer lines throughout the collection system to help prevent blockages.
