



ORDER OF THE MAYOR OF DURHAM
CONSENTING TO APPLICATION WITHIN THE CITY OF DURHAM OF THE
*TENTH AMENDMENT TO THE DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN DURHAM COUNTY, NC
TO COORDINATE PROTECTIVE ACTIONS TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 (SAFER AT HOME ORDER)*
DATED SEPTEMBER 4, 2020

AND, FURTHER
ADOPTING THE SAFER AT HOME ORDER OF DURHAM COUNTY FOR THE PURPOSES OF HAVING
A UNIFIED LOCAL SAFER AT HOME ORDER AND MAKING IT APPLICABLE WITHIN THOSE
PORTIONS OF THE CITY OF DURHAM IN DURHAM COUNTY

WHEREAS, Durham County Board of Commissioners Chair Wendy Jacobs has signed a tenth amended order adopting restrictions mandated by the Governor of the State of North Carolina that residents of Durham County are advised or required to implement in response to the COVID-19 Public Health Crisis; and,

WHEREAS, said proclamation and the restrictions contained therein may be made applicable within the City of Durham's jurisdiction with the consent of the Mayor of Durham pursuant to N.C.G.S. 166A-19.22(b)(2); and,

WHEREAS, a portion of the City of Durham does not lie within the boundaries of Durham County.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Stephen M. Schewel, Mayor of the City of Durham, do hereby proclaim the continued existence of a STATE OF EMERGENCY within the City of Durham, and, pursuant to the authority granted to me by State law and City Ordinance, hereby ORDER as follows:

1. For the reasons and based on the findings spelled out in the attached Eighth Amendment to the Declaration of State of Emergency in Durham County, NC to Coordinate Protective Actions to Prevent the Spread of COVID-19 (Safer At Home Order) of the Chair of the Durham County Board of Commissioners, I consent to the application of said Safer At Home Order, dated September 4, 2020, within the City of Durham pursuant to N.C.G.S. Sec. 166A-19.22(b)(2).
2. For the reasons and based on the findings spelled out in the attached Safer At Home Order of the Chair of the Durham County Board of Commissioners, I further adopt and order the terms of said Safer At Home Order to be applicable within the portions of the City of Durham in Durham County.
3. That all City of Durham sworn law enforcement officers, emergency response personnel, and all other employees subject to the control and supervision of the City of Durham cooperate in the enforcement and implementation of the provisions of the attached Durham County Safer At Home Order, dated September 4, 2020.

This Order shall take effect on Friday, September 4, 2020, at 5:00 p.m., and shall remain in effect until properly rescinded or modified by the undersigned, with the understanding that the Durham County Safer At Home Order will be regularly reviewed and evaluated by Durham County in consultation with the City of Durham, for its necessity and efficacy, and that it may be revised, amended, and/or extended based upon the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, existing evidence, and recommendations by federal, state and local public health authorities, or the Response and Recovery Task Force.
